Where Does All Our Money Go? (continued)

Temple Sinai General Fund: Funds received are used for general purposes. These funds designated for the general operating budget.

Yizkor/Yahrzeit Fund: Donations to this fund are made in honor of the memory of our dearly departed. These funds also help to offset the costs of operating Temple Sinai.

Scholar –In –Residence Fund: Funds pledged for this purpose help us to sponsor this exceptional event.

Legacy and Endowment Fund: These monies are invested and the proceeds are designated for several purposes. Some proceeds help defray the costs of operating our Temple, but much of the proceeds from this fund are used for educational purposes, such as scholarships for March of the Living.

Prestigious Pre-Ks (rooms 111 & 113)

At Thanksgiving we traditionally tell the story of how the Pilgrims came to be here in America. But how many Jewish families were actually on the Mayflower? This year like in the past, our Pre-K classes engaged in a study of "Coming To America." The children and their families set off on a meaningful journey to learn how their families traveled to America and what country their families originated from. Did they come by boat, plane, or train, why did they come, and/or what special things did they bring? The children discussed these things, made a chart of the different types of transportation used by each family to get to America, and they talked about how the children would pack if they were moving to a new faraway place. Through a unit such as "Coming To America," the children learned about their own families and were able to share their own history with their friends. Clearly, Thanksgiving is an American holiday that can have deep meanings for young Jewish children.

Amazing Art with Ms. Sheila



As an art specialist, I first focused my attention on each child's developmental abilities. My intention is to introduce and acquaint each child with hands-on experiences. This is accomplished with various art materials and the processes the children create. They work step-by-step to achieve their final masterpieces. The importance is not what the design is, but that they had many opportunities to work with different media and demonstrate their creativity and listening skills.

Our toddlers enjoyed using brushes to tap on a color for their turkey paper bags. Next they added silk leaves and tissue paper by using glue to complete their project.

Our 2s designed their Thanksgiving placemats and developed their fine motor skills using cookie cutters. Up, down, and circular movements with brushes and rollers gave way to a pre-writing workout.

Our fabulous 3s created paper cup turkeys and counted six popsicle sticks to hold up their tie-dyed feathers. This was a wonderful lesson in color identification and counting.

Our 4s created a wall-hanging turkey by tracing their hands as stencils to create feathers, painted a background, and rolled yarn into a ball. Voila!! A fabulous holiday wall hanging.

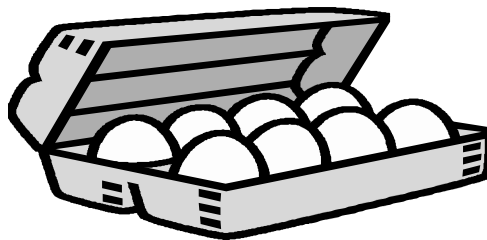

The following is a speech written and delivered by Gaby Dunn

The Save Darfur Now: Voices to Stop Genocide Rally that took place September 17th in the sweltering heat of Central Park coincided with the 61st General Assembly of the United Nations in New York. The protestors were mostly high school and college kids bussed in from schools all over the United States. They held green “Not on Our Watch” signs in their hands, wore orange “Victims of Darfur” stickers on their chests, and donned blue berets on their heads representing a desire for United Nations peace-keeping forces in Sudan. However, as I overheard a group asking rally organizers when the O.A.R. concert started, I wondered if these teenagers really understood what it was they were a part of. Yes, the band O.A.R. performed that day but did these teeny-boppers fully understand why that was? In the time of Vietnam and Woodstock, I highly doubt anyone would have called a war protest a “Hendrix concert.” There was a social and political consciousness back then that was lacking at the rally.

In the aftermath of everyone’s favorite gift-giving holiday Chanukah, it’s important to realize that while you might not have received the Playstation 3 you wanted or the necklace you dropped hints to your husband about for months, there are men in Sudan being killed as warriors, women being systematically raped while trying to collect water for their villages and children burned as their homes are engulfed in flames. I don’t mean to be dramatic. There are problems all over the world. Why should we as individual people, as Jews in America, care about something happening oceans away to a group of African Muslims?

This past summer, I worked with thirteen year olds for eight weeks at Camp Ramah Darom in Clayton, Georgia. One of the activities my fellow counselors and I did with the campers was to set up a “Darfur museum” with low-lighting, pictures and descriptions of real people living in the hell that is Sudan. Ninety compulsively rambunctious children walked in collective silence through that “museum.” In a group discussion afterwards, it was revealed that many of them had had no idea genocide was going on. They were shocked and upset but just as equally moved to action. That night, they wrote letters to President Bush and their congressmen or spoke of going back home in August and educating their friends, families and middle schools. I felt more real emotions and desire for action from the thirteen year olds towards the situation in Sudan than I did from most people I’d spoken to about the genocide.

We should care because it is genocide. Because it happened to us and our parents and our grandparents. Because there are people sitting in this room who remember exactly what it is like to be targeted for your religion, for your “race.” We know. No other group living inside these privileged borders does and that makes this our responsibility. We let the words “Never again” so casually slip through our lips – well now, here’s our chance to prove it. “Never again” is not only a promise to the Jewish people, it’s a promise to the world. We promised. Now, it’s time to act on that promise.

The current Jews passive mindset surrounding Darfur needs to change. Darfur is still going on even though the rally I attended is over. The Janjaweed, a militia supported by the Sudanese government, are still plowing through African Muslims villages, mutilating the men and boys and systematically gang-raping the women and girls simply for being African and Muslim. Three million people are on life support, unsure if they will survive to see tomorrow.

Secretary Madeline Albright, who spoke as eloquently as ever at the rally, reminded participants that “protection of the innocent is a universal responsibility.” Speaker Rabbi Steve Gutow, executive director of the Jewish Council of Public Affairs, invoked the words of the Hebrew prophet Isaiah, “What have we done to bring justice to the world?”

Whatever it is, it is not enough. The “climate of terror” in Darfur, as Albright called it in her speech does not end at any designated time unless we force it to. I am unsure if Albright was using President Bush’s catchphrase in an attempt to show what a real “climate of terror” is like but the juxtaposition is clear. The Sudanese are constantly living under a “climate of terror” and not just because someone brought a water bottle aboard an airplane. Four hundred thousand Darfurians are already dead, a death count that is increasing exponentially. There hasn’t been an attack on American soil in five years.

Journalist Ethan Rafal, who’d been captured in Darfur, reminded rally-ers that “we must act” because “for Darfur there is absolutely no where left to run.” You all have a choice. You do not have to go home and glance at the crawl screen on CNN and simply shake your heads in disdain. You can single yourself out from the crowd, take action and choose to really feel for these victims. Attend a rally. Donate money to the One Campaign at one.org and sign a protest letter to President Bush and Kofi Annan at savedarfur.org. Do something, please. It is our responsibility. Rafal vocalized what I had been wondering that day in the city and what I wonder now, looking out at you, the Jewish community, “The question remains: Will we end this genocide?”

Thank you.



2006 is drawing to a close. Although the violence in Darfur continues to grow, we've made remarkable progress in raising awareness of the crisis among the public and decision makers around the world with your help.

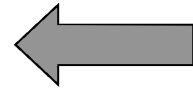
