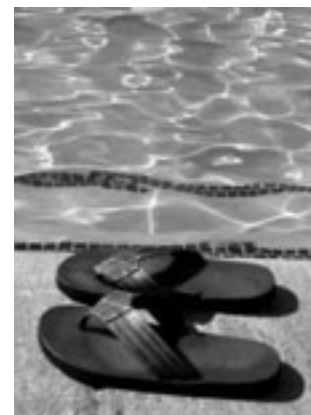

# MARCH OF LIVING... IMPRESSIONS

*Six teens and two parents from Temple Sinai participated in the March of the Living this spring and shared their experiences with us on Shabbat morning, May 31st. The participants on the March were Sarah Honig, Jared Pines, Sarah Anton, Abbie Lande, Zach and Sandy Roberts. Mimi Roberts and Jack Pines also accompanied the group. We heard that morning from several of the teens about their impressions of their experiences in Poland and then of their triumphant entry into Israel to celebrate Yom Ha'Atzmaut.*

*Here are the words that Sarah Anton and Sarah Honig shared with us...*

The March of the Living was the most meaningful experience of my life. It sounds cliché, but in reality, nothing deeply touches the very essence of what it means to be Jewish the way the March does. The experiences you learn in two weeks on this trip are more than what you'd learn in two weeks in a classroom.

As my departure date approached, I felt both excited and anxious. I was eager to meet new friends, travel to Israel, and celebrate Israel's sixtieth birthday in Jerusalem. On the other hand, I was nervous to view the reality of the Holocaust and to stand in the places of mass destruction. Yet, I knew that this was to be an experience I would never forget. During the emotional week in Poland, we explored synagogues, towns, and other historic Jewish sites. The focal point of the trip is a March tracing the path Holocaust victims walked from the Auschwitz concentration camp to the gas chambers of Birkenau. With the sun, birds singing, blue sky, and fields of dandelions, it's hard to really imagine the heinous crimes that had happened there. I only saw those places in black and white history films. Now I was given the chance to see them in color. As we walked throughout the concentration camps, the most heartbreaking piece was the survivors' testimonies of the actual times when they were held in the camps. We left Poland wondering how it was possible for the destruction of an entire generation of Jews to occur; but we pledged to be the witness of the witness.

After a long and agonizing week in Poland, we were finally on our way to the Jewish homeland of Israel. We traveled to Israel to observe Yom HaZikaron, Israel Memorial Day, and Yom Ha'Atzmaut, Israel Independence Day. During our activities on Yom HaZikaron, we were constantly looking forward to the time ahead because as the day turned into evening, the holiday in Israel changed as well. Israeli Remembrance Day transformed into Israeli Independence Day, the sixtieth anniversary of Israel's independence and one of the most joyful days on the Israeli calendar. That night was spent on Ben Yehuda Street, the main shopping area in Jerusalem. But with the sound of laughter and excitement filled the air, it was hard not to think of the week before. When the coupling of a tremendous tragedy with the rebirth of Israel is back to back, the impact becomes long lasting. You're going from death and destruction to regeneration and rebirth.

Our week in Israel seemed much shorter because of our enthusiasm and spirit but it was time to come back home to our parents and friends. Looking back on the March of the Living, I realize how fortunate I am to have participated in such a journey. Jewish identity is found in linking ourselves to our past and the March of the Living brings this understanding to life.

Finally, I want to take this opportunity to thank Esther Gordon Paulen for her sponsoring of the March of the Living Scholarship. My family has known her and her family long before I was born so it was really special that her generosity allowed me to go on this amazing adventure. Thank you, Aunt Esther, for giving me this incredible opportunity.

## Impressions from The March of the Living

We arrived in Poland on April 28th. Everyone, even the airport employees stared at the plane. No one was accustomed to seeing an EL AL jumbo jet land in Krakow. From there we went to different places with names like Jew St. in Tarnow - passing the old businesses that used to belong to Jewish families who lived there before the war.

The March itself took place at Auschwitz-Birkenau. 10,000 people; mostly students from all over the world, marched from the entrance gate at Auschwitz to the gas chambers of Birkenau to honor the memory of the people who entered there - but never came back out.

Auschwitz was the most beautiful place I had ever been to. It was lush and green and had big shady trees. The brick buildings looked like an Ivy League college campus. Then one of the survivors said - "If this grass was here when I was here, we would have eaten it"... We went to a camp called Majdanek (My-don-ick). It was kept just as it was when the Russians liberated the camp - Ashes in the ovens, wooden

pushers, cylon gas stains on the walls. Right in the middle of Lublin, a major city! Even today, this camp could be up and running in 48 hours. I heard there's a Yeshiva in that city now.

The second week we went to Israel. It was my first time there, and it was very beautiful. There was a giant - and I mean GIANT party at Zion Square for Yom Haatzmaut - Independence Day.

We visited memorials, the western wall and other sites. When I was at an archeological dig, I wanted to be an archeologist. When I was at the Guide Dog Center, I wanted to be a guide dog trainer. But when I thought of the people that were lost in Poland and other places, and then I saw a sea of people celebrating Israel on Ben Yehuda St. - I wanted to be... a Jew.
