A palpable feeling of spiritual awareness begins to well up with in us as we approach the High Holiday season. Beginning with the first day of *Elul*, the final month on the ancient Hebrew calendar, even people with only marginal attachment to the Jewish community suddenly begin to consider the Holy season. One of the strongest strings that tugs at the Jewish heart, binds one generation to the next and helps to maintain our attachment to tradition is our Jewish liturgical music.

Nusach is the term we use to describe the centuries old sacred music we use for the Jewish prayer service. The system of *Nusach* that is employed here at Temple Sinai dates back at least to the Tenth Century hub of *Ashkenazi* tradition, the great Jewish communities of central Germany. Every prayer of every service has an associated set of musical rules that guide its chanting; these rules constitute the *Nusach* of that prayer or service.

There are three basic elements that combine to make up the *Nusach* for a particular prayer: The Prayer mode, one of a set of special musical scales that are utilized in Jewish liturgical music is the primary element of *Nusach*. *Mi Sinai* (from Mt. Sinai) Tunes, specific melodies that have been handed down for hundreds of years, such as *Kol Nidre* or the *Aleinu* of the High Holidays during which the Hazzan falls prostrate on the floor, comprise the second element of *Nusach*. Special motives or little pieces of music that define the beginnings and endings of phrases and shape the sound of each prayer service constitute the third element of *Nusach*.

When a Hazzan or other prayer leader who is knowledgeable in *Nusach* chants the service, he or she uses the *Nusach* as an artist uses the colors of his pallet to paint the meaning of the prayers. The words of our sacred liturgy spring from the page of the prayer book and fly into our consciousness on the wings of the appropriate *Nusach*.

Ironically, there are times when the *Nusach* is more powerful than the words themselves. *Kol Nidre*, as noted above, is one such example. The text of *Kol Nidre* is a dry legal formula similar to the boiler plate text on the bottom of a real-estate contract or credit card application. However, the melody of *Kol Nidre* has the power to bring tears to our eyes as we recall the many *Kol Nidre's* we experienced with our dear ones – especially those who are no longer with us. We recall the feelings we shared on Yom Kippur in days gone by while at the same time contemplating the future with awe and trepidation.

I always compare using *Nusach* to making a *Lockshin Kugel* (noodle pudding). Although there are many varieties of ingredients that cooks like to use, fruit, mushrooms, onions etc. But if you don't use noodles, it's not a *Lockshin Kugel*. Similarly, there is much room for improvisation and personal and regional differences in our prayer service, but if we don't follow the basic rules, the service is not being chanted according to the authentic *Nusach*.

Of course the advantage to *Nusach* is that it makes every service unique and highlights the special nature of each Jewish occasion. Just as if one were to light candles and eat chicken soup at every meal, *Shabbat* would not feel special; so too, if we were to use the *Shabbat Nusach* every day, the *Shabbat Tephilot* (Prayers) would not feel special. Moreover, song such as the majestic *Nusach* of the

High Holiday evening service, the downwardly cascading supplication of the confessional *Nusach* or the heart rendering, plaintive strains of the *Yizkor* service, gives voice to the unique unspoken emotions that imbue each occasion. Finally, *Nusach* not only connects every Shul of the same tradition around the world together, it forms a musical chain which links generation to generation from the ancient past to the distant future.

There is no better way to strengthen your connection to our heritage and enhance your spirituality than to forge your own link in this eternal chain of tradition by learning to become a more active part of our services. The feeling you get when, for the first time, you read from a Torah scroll that has remained exactly the same for thousands of years, or chant the same *Haftara* that was heard by our ancestors who walked with the ancient prophets, or lead the community in prayer with the proper *Nusach* is beyond description.

This past year, several parents have taken the opportunity to learn alongside their Bar/Bat Mitzvah students and chant a Torah portion at their child's Bar/Bat Mitzvah. Moreover, several adults in our community have chosen either to mark special birthdays or celebrate their own adult Bar/Bat Mitzvah by learning how to chant from the Torah and/or lead services. Still others have decided to learn to read Hebrew or just to become more intimate with the language and meaning of our prayers. Some have even come to our Shabbat afternoon (Mincha) services and suddenly found themselves taking an Aliya to the Torah for the first time as the rest of the warm and welcoming worshipers sang *Siman Tov U Mazal Tov*. Sharing that to which an esteemed teacher has referred as a "*Shebechianu Moment*".

So this High Holiday season, heed the call of the Shofar and nurture that feeling of spiritual awareness that wells up in your heart. Deepen the meaning you can draw from the well of our culture connect to that ancient chain of tradition; take an active role in our spiritual heritage. I will be delighted to work with individuals or groups who would like to embark on this rich and rewarding journey to claim their place in our history. Changing directions in the Religious school.....

The challenge of the Religious School is teaching everything related to the Jewish life in 3½ hours a week.

It has to be in a way that engages a child who comes after a whole day of sitting and listening to their teachers at the secular school. There's no way these students can have the attention span to learn Hebrew, prayers, and more...

Taking this into consideration, we decided to change the way we will teach at Hebrew School.

First,(last year) we changed the classrooms setting:

- Learning centers with a library, Hebrew corner and games.
- Children sitting at tables shared with 3 or 4 more classmates, instead the traditional individual desk

After the "physical" change we wanted the children to enjoy their learning at school. We had to twist a little bit our educational strategies. With a Montessori framework of educational techniques, we are in the very first steps of the process to change our educational philosophy to teach at Hebrew School.

When the traditional school goes for the success of the individual student, we promote the success through learning in Chevrutah(group learning) .When traditional school goes for a Hebrew program where everybody has to follow a textbook ,on the same page, without consideration of the individual differences of the students and their rhythms of learning, we at Hebrew school started to work on an innovative Hebrew Program. It is a self-paced program which allows each students to work according his/her own ability.

The times our children are living are demanding a change in the way we teach

We just started. We are convinced that our journey will be a success!
